### **The School**

Highland Park High School, located in Middlesex County, New Jersey, is a four-year public co-educational high school that prepares its graduates for a wide variety of post high school educational placements. A single comprehensive curriculum allows all students, with counselor assistance, to design a program tailored to their needs, abilities, and interest. HPHS operates on a traditional full-year schedule with semester options. The Highland Park School District is comprised of one high school, a middle school, an elementary school and a primary school. The high school's current enrollment is 484 students with a 180:1 student to counselor ratio. The teaching faculty consists of 67 professionals.

### **The Community**

The community of Highland Park, which has a population of 14,060 is contiguous to Edison and New Brunswick, the location of Rutgers University. Current demographic statistics for the grade 9-12 program are: 21% Asian, 10% African American, 19% Hispanic, 4% Multiracial, 42% Caucasian, and 1% other.
